ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTION NO. 56

Sub: - Requesting for Financial Assistance to Conduct- Pre-Teen, Sub-Junior & Junior National Pencak Silat Championship (Boys & Girls) at Nanded (Maharashtra) from 13th to 16th January 2023.

Sir,

I am directed to say that Competent Authority, has agreed in principle, to the sanction of a grant not exceeding Rs. 20,00,000/- (**Rupees Twenty lakh only**.) to the Secretary General , **Indian Pencak Silat Federation of India** for conducting above mentioned championship. **This grant is of non-recurring nature**. As per terms and conditions of MYAS's letter no. 12-2/2020-SP-III dated 28.02.2022, the assistance indicated above shall be utilized for the provision of lodging & Boarding, Hiring of FOP/Equipment, payment of Technical officials, and Prize money. Only up to Rs. 2000/- per head per day for "A" Class city and up to Rs. 1000/- per head per day. At other venues will be admissible. The NSF's are expected to meet the expenses on other items from their own resources. The federation shall take steps to ensure participation of all the affiliated units in the national level championships. In case less than 75% of the affiliated units participate, the scale of assistance will be reduced by 25% and no grant shall be provided in case less than 50% of the affiliated units participate. This condition would apply for males and females separately.

2. The grant is subject to the conditions mentioned below:-

(i) That at least 75% of the total affiliated units will take part in the Championship. In Case percentage of participation is between 50 and 74.9 Government grant will be reduced by 25%. However, no grant will be payable for participation below 50%.

(ii) That the grantee shall execute a bond with two sureties to the President of India for acceptance terms and conditions of the payment of Grant-in-aid before release the payment.

(iii) The grantee shall maintain subsidiary accounts of the grant-in-aid received from the Government.

(iv) The grantee shall maintain a register of assets in the prescribed form GFR 19. The assets acquired wholly or substantially out of Government grant except those declared as obsolete and unserviceable or condemned as per the procedure laid down in the General Financial Rules shall not be disposed of without the prior approval of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.

(v) The amount so paid to the grantee shall be open to inspection by the Sports Authority of India whenever the grantee is called upon to do so.

(vi) The account shall be audited by the International Auditors of grantee and finally by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under Section 14 of the CAG of India (Duties, Power and conditions of Services) Act 1971.

(vii) The grantee shall not divert the grants and entrust execution of the scheme or work concerned to another institution of organization and shall abide by the terms and conditions of the grant. If the grantee fails to utilize the grant, for the purpose for which the same has been sanctioned, the grantee will be required to refund the entire amount with interest thereon @ 10% per annum. As per Rule 209(6) (ix).

(viii) The UC should also disclose whether the specified, quantified and qualitative target that should have been reached against the amount utilized, were in fact reached, and if not, the reasons therefore As per Rule 212 (1).

(ix) The accounts of all grantee institutions or organizations shall be open to inspection by the sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG (DPC) Act, 1971 and internal audit by the Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry or Department, whenever the institution or organization is called upon to do so and a provision to this effect should invariably be incorporated in all orders sanctioning grants-in-aid. As per Rule 211 (1).

(x) The grantee shall submit the utilization certificate in the prescribed form GFR 12 A received for the purpose duly signed by the General Secretary/President within 12 months after closure of financial year as per Rule 212(1) of GFR.

(xi) The grantee agrees to make reservation for Scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in posts/services under its control on the lines indicated by the Government of India.

(xii) That the grant is adjustable on the basis of the actual expenditure. For this purpose a statement indicating the list of participants (state-wise) and a audited statement of income and expenditure (duly audited by a Chartered Accountant) in the manner as mentioned in Para 2 above may be sent to this Ministry.

(xiii) That a performance cum achievement report (2 copies) in respect of the above event for which that grant has been sanctioned should be forwarded to this Ministry within 6 months of the event.

(xiv) That no advertisement of tobacco and Liquor will be displayed during the event, the breach of which entails the cancellation of Government grant.

(xv) That in case of Senior Championship, the Federation will have to conduct the Junior and Sub-Junior Championships in the same financial year. In case these are not conducted, the grant released for the Senior Championship will be recovered from the Federation.

(xvi) That it should be compulsory for the Federation to hold State level tournaments in all states for both Men & Women.

(xvii) As far as district tournaments are concerned, it should be held in at least 50% district for Men & Women before the Federation becomes eligible for release of remaining grants and fresh assistance.


(xvii) The grant in aid is further subject to the conditions laid down in GFR's as amended from time to time.

3. Reference to the ministry's letter no. F. 8-06/2011-SP.III Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (Department of Sports), Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi-01 dated 23rd February, 2011, now the proposals for holding National Championships, International Tournaments in India and visit of Indian Sportspersons/ Teams Abroad, as per their approved Annual Calendar for Training and Competition (ACTC), received from the NSF's will be processed by the Sports Authority of India, TEAMS Division, JN Stadium Complex, New Delhi.

4. The amount of the grant will be debitable to the head, under the provision of the Scheme of Financial Assistance to the National Sports Federations (NSFs).

5. An amount of **Rs. 15,00,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Lakh Only)** will be drawn as advance and transfer to **Indian Pencak Silat Federation of India**. Remaining amount will be paid soon after receipt of UCs from the Federation.
